The coat shop is completely ready, and we have already started distributing winter gear to several of the folks that have arrived in Worcester.

At this point we have been able to organize enough to recognize what we now need most... we have a great supply of Women's short coats and lots of toddler sizes, but we are definitely lacking in men's medium and large size coats, as well as larger size kids coats.

URGENT NEED!!

We have discovered that many of the women coming in to get coats are still wearing flip flops, if anyone has any new or like new warm women's shoes or low boots in sizes 7, 8, or 9. We could definitely use them, or perhaps you would consider donating a few dollars that we could put towards purchasing some women's shoes.

We could also use more of the thicker warm gloves for both men and women.

We would like to ask that only heavy-duty coat hangers be donated, the thin metal hangers that come from dry cleaning are not strong enough to support the weight of the winter coats and with no other way to repurpose them, they meet an unfortunate future by becoming additional trash in our dumpster.

M.L. King Book Drive for Worcester 2nd and 3rd graders

Worcester Area Mission Society (WAMS), the United Way of Central MA, and others are inviting you to give books to 2nd and 3rd graders in Worcester Public Schools. The goal of the book drive is to give age-appropriate books to young children who may not have access to many books at home. I think we all know the value of books in expanding horizons and increasing the language skills of reading, speaking and writing.

There is a suggested book list available on the <u>WamsWorks</u> website, which includes books about Dr. King and other wonderful books by authors who are people of color. I've listed a few books below for those of you who cannot access the website. These are just suggestions, of course, and you may have your own favorites. Additionally, some of these books may be easier to find than others. Two independent bookstores are cooperating with us on this project by making as many titles as they can, available for purchase:
