What issues or situations in our society presently need focused attention and compassion? What would release, healing, and justice look like for those issues/situations? How do you see yourself playing a role? What do you think the call to our congregation is?
- What does it look like to build community across differences? How have you grown or what have you learned through interactions with people who think or live differently than you do? What is needed in order to build more inclusive community? What does it mean to be welcoming of all people, to value and affirm each person for who they are? How can we as a congregation better embody God's love in the world?
