Questions for Reflection —

- ➤ In what areas of your life and in what ways do you feel confined by prescribed roles and expectations of others? How might that change if you fix your eyes on Jesus? What are the conventions and stereotypes that might be limiting your response to the nudgings of the Holy Spirit? What do you need in order to be able to move beyond those boundaries? What is your capacity to not just listen for but to actually hear and follow God's call to new and surprising things?
- ➤ What is the status quo in your life that is challenged by the teachings of Jesus? What teachings of Jesus are most difficult for you or make you feel uncomfortable as you consider following them in your life? What is it about those teachings that challenges you? What would it look like for you to have a change of heart when it comes to such teachings? What will it take for you to live into this change of heart?
- ➤ When and how in your life have you engaged with someone you have considered "other" in some way? What was that experience like? What did you learn and how did you grow? What do you think it means for God's kin-dom to be inclusive of all? What is your role and the role of our congregation in helping to make that kin-dom a reality beyond the walls of the church in a hurting world? What does it mean for us to love those whom we consider "other" or "outsider" as God would have us love them?
