We are donating some before then to groups working with homeless people.

Prevent Homelessness through Grocery Shopping – *Please note the new date for January!*

We are working hard to prevent many families from becoming homeless, as more people face eviction either due to the pandemic, or because rents keep going up, we are seeing many seniors, families and low-wage earners struggling even more. Central Mass. Housing Alliance makes bulk purchases of gift cards at a discount, and the difference from their face value goes into a fund to cover back rent or utility bills.

Worcester Area Mission Society (WAMS), the United Way of Central MA, and others are inviting you to give books to 2nd and 3rd graders in Worcester Public Schools. The goal of the book drive is to give age-appropriate books to young children who may not have access to many books at home. I think we all know the value of books in expanding horizons and increasing the language skills of reading, speaking, and writing.
