Why every gift card sale matters

An older couple living on a fixed income had been evicted, their home condemned. Living in a hotel, they had put all their furniture and household goods in storage. But they fell behind in payments for their storage unit. The storage company was going to auction off their possessions on December 1. Their Social Security check wouldn't arrive until December 3. They planned to move to a new home December 5.

On November 30, the couple sought help from the Hope for Housing grant fund at Central Mass. Housing Alliance. A grant of \$250 paid off the storage bill and meant they could start off in their new home with their familiar furnishings.

Every gift card sale contributes 2 to 10 percent of the face value to this grant fund created to prevent homelessness. Cards are available from grocery stores, CVS, Panera, Target, Amazon, TJ Maxx/Marshalls, Dunkin and Starbucks.
