- How would you define Christian hospitality and fellowship? What does barrier-breaking hospitality look like across differences in race, ethnicity, economic class, gender, nationality, language? What people in our context might feel marginalized and excluded? What do hospitality and inclusion look like for the most vulnerable, overlooked, and marginalized people among us? How can we make sure everyone and all feel invited and included? How can we as a congregation seek to further build beloved community and embody God's vision for a more loving world?
