**From William's Desk...** Today's music centers around the genesis of Johann Pachelbel who until recently was just a figure from history. The popularity of his *Canon in D* has almost made him a household word for the untold times *Canon in D* has been played for wedding processionals around the globe. You will recognize the bass line in the offertory anthem as the foundation of the *Canon*. Jean Anne Shafferman "discovered" that *Canon in D* and *Amazing Grace* can be "partner songs" meaning two independent compositions that can be performed simultaneously. So, in making this "discovery" she has put these two pieces together forever with some slight arranging. What definitely must match are the harmonies between the two tunes. Timing of the tunes can be arranged to a degree that they are compatible. Organ prelude is one of Pachelbel's many chorale partitas which is German for variation. Pachelbel was the last great composer of the Nuremberg tradition and the last important southern German composer. Pachelbel's influence was mostly limited to his pupils, most notably Johann Christoph Bach, who was an older brother of Johann Sebastian Bach.
