MUSIC NOTES

It isn't very often composers are siblings but in the case of the Mendelssohns it was obvious growing up in their home they would be drawn to music and composition where they regularly heard concerts at their large estate in Berlin. Both Fanny and Felix showed promise while in their teen years at composing songs. While Fanny was not encouraged to continue composing Felix was groomed to become a professional musician.

Due to her family's reservations, and to social conventions of the time about the roles of women, six of her songs were published under her brother's name in his <u>Opus</u> 8 and 9 collections. In 1829, she married artist <u>Wilhelm Hensel</u> and, in 1830, they had their only child, <u>Sebastian Hensel</u>. In 1846, despite the continuing ambivalence of her family towards her musical ambitions, Fanny Hensel published a collection of songs as her Opus 1. She died of a stroke in 1847.

Felix had a successful career as a composer and performer. He also died from a stroke in November 1847, age 38, after Fanny who died in May 1847. Niels Gade knew the Mendelssohns and was a pall bearer at Felix's funeral.
