# Tower & Rose Window Lightings & Altar Flowers



## A God Moment by Susan Williams

In 2002, on Thursdays, my schedule was packing bags at Carty Cupboard, walking 3 times around Elm Park, and visiting my mom at Clark Nursing Home. She was 87, had Alzheimer's, was blind and had recently suffered a stroke.

On Thursday, April 10th, I packed bags at Wesley and then went to Elm Park. On the sidewalk (Park Avenue side) I looked down and, hopping around my feet, was a baby squirrel. I was <u>very</u> surprised, and the people present were as well. I saw his mom hanging head-down on a nearby tree, so I gently walked him back into the park. This happened two more times.

I decided to walk through the park to my car when a memory flashed through my mind. In April of 1956, when I was about 14 years old, our dog caught a baby squirrel. My mom rescued him, and we raised him until he was old enough to live on his own. Then mom released him.

I stopped in my tracks and asked God, "Is my mom going to die today?" I went to visit her for a while and then went home. A couple of hours later, I received a call from the nursing home and went back. I was with her when she passed and felt such Peace, released. Why? I realized I had mourned for years as I watched her slowly fade from reality, and now, she was home.
