Volunteering for Wesley's IHN Week-- Sunday, Oct. 29 to Sat., Nov. 4

Please let Betsy Pennino know if you are able to provide coverage for the evening shift (5:30 to 8:30 pm) or the overnight (8:30 pm to 6:30 am) during Wesley's week at In the Hour of Need Family Shelter (IHN). (I expect to be at Wesley every Sunday until then, or you can use the sign-up sheet on the Mission Bulletin Board.) If you would like an explanation of how to do either shift, please ask Betsy.

Currently volunteers may choose to stay in the IHN office or move around the house to interact with the families. Volunteers no longer provide dinners but are encouraged to bring food to prepare their own.

The Mission Committee will give IHN Hope for Housing cards to pay for food and housing staples during Wesley's Oct. 29 to Nov. 4 week. Your donating these Big Y cards would save money to give to another mission.

Here's a Chance to Prevent Homelessness

It's a simple idea -- buy your groceries (or your coffee or toiletries) and help a local family stay in their home. You'll be joining area stores in contributing to a fund that gives grants to families facing eviction. One back rent payment, utility bill or storage unit fee can keep families out of the shelter system and all the disruption to their children's schooling.

Here's how it works: When you purchase gift cards from Big Y, Shaw's, Stop & Shop, CVS, Dunkin Donuts, Panera, Starbucks, Amazon, Target or TJ Maxx/Marshalls/Home Goods, a percentage of that card's value is donated by those stores to Central Mass. Housing Alliance. Families come to CMHA seeking assistance, and since this program began, hundreds of families have received aid.

Look for the birdhouse in Brewer Hall -- at a table near the stage -- after church services. Cards are for sale every Sunday and by email to AChis4788@aol.com. Order by Monday, October 23 for pickup on Sunday, October 29.

Come choose a Sunday to help with card sales -- it takes a team to tackle a challenge as big (and fast-growing) as homelessness.

A God Moment from Betsy Pennino

About 2 years before I met my husband, I asked my dad, and tried to find the old church in a park where we had picnicked every year until my twenties. My dad said it was in West Boylston on a reservoir. When I was living in Acton and met my husband-to-be, I found out that he lived half a mile from that old church! Almost no one I'd met in Massachusetts knew the location of Plattsburgh, NY where I had grown up-- but he did. Bruce had often heard about it from his mother who had attended Plattsburgh Normal School (where people trained to be teachers in the 1930's). She had decided to go there as a high school graduate in northern New Jersey! Her father believed that young women didn't need higher education and refused to contribute, so Betty cleaned houses.

Move ahead 25 years and little Betsy went to that very same school for nursery school through grade 8! By then it was Plattsburgh State Teachers' College (and eventually SUNY Plattsburgh). PSTC had a Campus School through grade 8 where every class had a head teacher and one or two student teachers who were in training.

Bruce's mother's name was Elizabeth Marie and mine is Mary Elizabeth. She went by "Betty" and I've always been "Betsy." Betty was a teacher for 40+ years and I was a teacher and then a counselor for most of my 40+ year career. Bruce says his mother would have loved to see me preparing classes on the same table she used.

I used to tell this story as a series of coincidences which people found remarkable. The story expanded as I recognized more connections. Now that I'm aware of God Moments, I feel that this story re-assures me that God had a plan for my life and, with God at my side, I found my way to a marriage and life in which I would be happy. May each of you Wesley folks see such connections or other signs that God is in your life! The reason for this column is to perhaps help others see the kinds of signs which contributors to the column have done their best to communicate.
