### **God Moments from Enoh**

(1) On Saturday, March 1, 2025, my husband decided to go to the car wash on West Boylston St. An hour later, he called to inform me that he had a flat tire. He told me to bring him the manual pump from home, but it didn't work. He had to call AAA who showed up but couldn't solve the problem either. AAA called the tow truck to take our car to the tire warehouse on Grove Street, Worcester, at about 6 pm.

On Sunday, March 2, at about 1:30 pm, the warehouse called to tell us that our car was all set, and we could pick it up. I was so shocked because I didn't expect them to work on Sunday. My husband and I were off on Saturday. He was going back to work on that Sunday night, and I was to be at work 5 am, Monday morning.

To God's Glory, the car was fixed on time, and we were not charged any amount.

- (2) My spring break from college started on 3/6/25. Two days later, I came down with a cold and cough. It lasted till 3/14/25. By Monday, 3/17/25, I was completely healed, so I was able to go back to work. What an awesome God!!!

A car that was going straight on Gold Star BLV, turned suddenly and crossed over my lane without any signal or waiting to clear before he turned. # **DID YOU KNOW?**


On Good Friday this year our sanctuary will be open for prayer and meditation from 12 Noon to 3 PM, the time when Christian tradition teaches that Jesus suffered and died on the cross. No matter where you are on Good Friday, at some point during the day you might engage the Good Friday tradition of meditation and reflection on the Seven Last Words of Christ. The Seven Last "Words" are not single words but phrases spoken by Jesus as he was dying on the cross. All the statements come from Gospel accounts of the crucifixion. However, there is no single account of the crucifixion that contains all seven of the sayings. In fact, only one of the quotations is found in more than one gospel. There is, however, a traditional ordering of the sayings based on a compilation of the story of the crucifixion as related in the four canonical gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The seven passages in the traditional order are as follows:

- 1. Father forgive them, for they know not what they do (Luke 23:34).
- 2. Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise (Luke 23:43).
- 3. Woman, behold your son: behold your mother (John 19:26-27).
- 4. Eli Eli lama sabachthani? "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34).
- 5. I thirst (John 19:28).
- 6. It is finished (John 19:30).
- 7. Father, into your hands I commit my spirit (Luke 23:46).

In part the tradition of a service (sometimes known as the Three Hours' Devotion) based on the words of Christ on the cross traces back to 4<sup>th</sup> Century Jerusalem, where each year the events of Jesus' life were commemorated by devotional services at what were believed to be the original sites of their occurrence. These services included a three hour devotion on Good Friday. While some of these observances (including celebration of Palm Sunday) of the ancient Jerusalem church found their way into the worship traditions of Christianity in general, the tradition of the "Three Hours' Devotion" was lost until it was revived in the 17<sup>th</sup> century by Jesuits in Peru and subsequently adopted by Roman Catholics as well as various Protestant denominations. The collection of sayings has been set to music by many composers, and the texts themselves are the basis for reflection by many Christians, not only on Good Friday, but throughout Lent and Holy Week.
