Questions for Reflection —

How are you being called in some practical way to live into your baptismal vows to "resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves"? How can we as a congregation demonstrate authentic empathy and compassion to the marginalized and the oppressed? How might we follow Jesus to walk a path that seeks justice for all people?
- What would it look like for you to live now into God's promise of resurrection? What prevents your living into God's promise of abundant life in the here and now? What in your life needs to die in order for resurrection to occur? What is the restoration, refreshment, and renewal you seek? What would living into resurrection look like for our congregation as we ponder our future? What might we have to be willing to let die so we can liv into the new life God places before us?
