- As we continue to journey through the Easter season where do you see signs of resurrection in your life and in our world? How are you continuing to live into the joy and hope of Easter? What interferes with your ability to do so? What do you need in order to continue to manifest Easter faith in your daily life? As our congregation faces an upcoming pastoral transition and continues our visioning process for our future what does it mean for us to be Easter people?
