### **Hope for Housing Cards Now All Digital**

The cause remains the same, but like many things these days, the process is digital. You can help prevent homelessness by buying gift cards online through Raise Right, an app you can download, and then specify Central Mass. Housing Alliance as your charity of choice. There are many more types of gift cards for purchase through the app, and CMHA's Hope for Housing grant fund receives anywhere from 2 to 10 percent of each card's value!

If you wish to order physical cards, you can do so with a flat-rate FedEx shipping charge.

#### **God Moment**

During the first week of June, IHN (In the Hour of Need Family Shelter) shut down, with all families living there moved to safe, affordable apartments. On June 8, IHN people are celebrating their 27 years of service to homeless families in Worcester. Friendly House will renovate 91 June St. for possible use by the MA Emergency Assistance Program.

They asked coordinators of volunteers to send in memories they had of being at IHN. I sent the following 2 two God Moments which happened at IHN, the first one in 2013:

#### A God Moment from Jean Grant

The Mission Committee and Sarah Circle spent a Saturday in May 2013 planting flowers and spreading mulch at the IHN house. Homeless families had first moved there during the previous February. Jean Grant wrote this after returning that fall to tend to the new plants:

As I finished up at the IHN house on June St. yesterday, pruning back flowers planted in the spring, I noticed that one lone flower still bloomed. A lone Easter lily trumpeted headstrong out of the garden. I was surprised to see a lily like that bloom in mid-autumn, but there it stood, petals open, announcing its presence like a white trumpet. As the rest of the flowers were browning, their blooms spent, save for a few yellow tickseed at the end of their bloom, the lone lily (brought by Emi Smith, I believe) stood tall. I couldn't bring myself to cut it back, so I left it there. I left IHN after a morning of work... the rest of the perennials pruned back to the ground for their winter slumber, awaiting their own rebirth in spring... while the lily, a symbol of purity, Easter hope and peace, stood resplendent in the fall sunshine, noting the almost 1-year anniversary of the house's opening. I don't think it was a coincidence.

#### **From Betsy Pennino**

There was another of those "unexplainable helpful coincidences" which have often occurred when doing Wesley mission work... One volunteer forgot her IHN shift in the difficulties of getting her father to the doctor. Her father had recently had a brain tumor removed and was very confused. Our volunteer didn't think to call for a replacement, and Director Joanne knew nothing about it. Yet a volunteer appeared at 7pm, someone from another church who had been well trained at IHN!
