Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) from Betsy Pennino

We were visiting a friend in a NJ Assisted Living facility. Bruce was in our hotel's lobby and saw a young man disinfecting tables and chairs. The spray had an unusually strong ammonia odor. Bruce remembered a co-worker who hadn't diluted ammonia with water and was found with a red face and barely breathing. He told the hotel staff member that he had mixed too potent a solution and there was danger to his own health.

We were also receivers of RAK on the trip. Our friend uses a walker on wheels. When she took one step to cross a busy street, drivers in both directions stopped and held back the traffic. Later our friend fell onto one knee and couldn't stand up. We couldn't lift her, and a kind man realized the situation and held her so that she didn't fall backwards before the EMT's arrived.

A note on Methodist history: We were in Ocean Grove which was founded in 1869 by a group of Methodist ministers. They wanted a permanent Methodist camp meeting site on the Jersey Shore. Crowds of up to 25,000 gathered for these summer camp meetings! To live in one of the small Ocean Grove houses, residents could not use alcohol or tobacco. Also forbidden were playing cards, chewing gum, dancing and reading novels! On Sundays, riding in vehicles and going to the beach were not allowed. The beaches were opened on Sundays after a lawsuit-- in 2024.



Wesley UMC Celebrates Debbie O'Driscoll as the Lay Spiritual Director

On Sunday, October 19, 2025, Wesley United Methodist Church joyfully affirmed **Debbie O'Driscoll** as our **Lay Spiritual Director**. Surrounded by our church family, Pastor Nizzi led a beautiful service of blessing and anointing, recognizing Debbie's faithful ministry and her ongoing call to guide the spiritual life of our community. The reflection and prayer below were shared by Pastor Nizzi during that special moment of affirmation.

Introduction: Debbie O'Driscoll

My first interaction with **Debbie O'Driscoll** was at a Board of Ordained Ministry gathering at Rolling Ridge Conference Center in Andover, Massachusetts three to four years ago. She was a new member then, and I was already in my 11th year serving on the team that examines candidates for provisional membership or ordination as full elders. I welcomed her warmly as part of the group — and that was it.

Now, seven weeks into my journey as your pastor here at **Wesley United Methodist Church**, I've had the blessing of getting to know Debbie more closely. Almost every week, she and I meet to talk through the details of Sunday worship. And after just three weeks — and with the gentle nudging of the Holy Spirit — I knew in my heart that it was time for us to formally affirm Debbie as a **Lay Spiritual Director** in this faith community.

Debbie is a retired pediatrician, but her ministry did not end with medicine. Like me, she pursued a Master of Divinity at **Boston University School of Theology** — she graduated in 2015, and I in 2002. We also share a connection through the **Gateways to God** program at Rolling Ridge Conference Center, where she earned a Certificate in Spiritual Direction and Congregational Formation. I, too, was shaped by that sacred space.

Many of you have known Debbie longer than I have. And many of you have been blessed by her quiet, faithful leadership. Here at Wesley, she has been a spiritual voice and guide — writing for our monthly newsletter *The Herald*, the *Did You Know*; weekly worship bulletin inserts, the *For the Journey* reflections, and the *Daily Reflection* emails that so many of us look forward to each day.

Debbie has said "yes" to God's call to care for the worship life and spiritual formation of this community — of you, the people who are friends of Wesley United Methodist Church. Today, we honor that call. We affirm her presence among us, and the gifts she brings to this body of Christ.

Anointing with Oil: A Symbol of God's Blessing

Anointing oil serves as a physical representation of God's sanctifying work. The act of anointing signifies a spiritual transformation — a transition from common to sacred, from ordinary to holy. When priests, kings, or sacred objects were anointed in the Bible, it signified divine approval and empowerment for a holy purpose.

For us, this tradition reminds us of God's presence and power to bless, sanctify, and fill us with divine joy. It reflects the work of the Holy Spirit — bringing peace, gladness, and courage for the ministry to which God calls us.

Gracious and Loving God, we give You thanks today for the life and faithful witness of Your beloved daughter, **Debbie O'Driscoll**.

From her years of tending to children as a pediatrician, to her pursuit of deeper wisdom at Boston University School of Theology, and through her sacred listening as a spiritual director — You have shaped her with compassion, insight, and grace.

We praise You for the gifts You have planted in her: for the clarity of her words, the steadiness of her presence, the tenderness of her care, and the depth of her faith.

You have called Debbie not only to serve, but to companion others on the journey — to create space for reflection, growth, and worship — to tend the souls of this community with humility and strength.

Today, as her church family, we affirm her call. We recognize the Spirit's movement in her life and bless the path she continues to walk among us. Lord, let her presence remind us that ministry is not bound by titles or roles, but by love made visible in service. Let her words continue to challenge and inspire. Let her leadership continue to be guided by wisdom, gentleness, and truth. Empower her with fresh courage for the days ahead,

and fill her with joy in the work You have given her to do.

DID YOU KNOW?

In the Christian calendar All Saints Day officially falls on November 1, but in the United Methodist tradition we observe All Saints Sunday on the first Sunday of November, usually in conjunction with the sacrament of Holy Communion. The term *Holy Communion* has connotations of the loving relationship we have with God and with each other, and also is an acknowledgement that when we receive the bread and grape juice, we are in communion or fellowship with one another in our congregation as well as with all Christians in the world. Moreover, this communion extends beyond the confines of both geography and time to unite us with Christ and all Christians throughout history, the "communion of saints" in which we express our belief when we recite the Apostles' Creed. In lighting candles and tolling a bell as the names of those dear to our congregation who have died in the past year, we remember the saints who have lived among us; we reflect on and give thanks for deceased persons who have been influential in our life as a congregation.


The visual environment of our sanctuary also reminds us of the communion of saints across time in the imagery in the *Te Deum* window (the large stained-glass window above the altar.) The *Te Deum Laudamus* (We praise you, O God) is the text of a very ancient hymn which is not only a testimony of praise and thanksgiving but also an expression of the faith of the church. The full text of this hymn can be found in the *United Methodist Hymnal* No. 80, *Canticle of the Holy Trinity* (UMH 80). In addition, the hymn *Holy God, We Praise Thy Name* (UMH 79) is a metrical English version of this text.

The text of the *Te Deum* is divided into three main sections. The first section is largely a hymn of praise to God the Father, although it concludes with a Trinitarian doxology. The second portion is Christological, a hymn of praise to Christ as Redeemer and Judge. The last section is a litany of short passages derived mostly from various psalms and contains elements of supplication as well as an expression of confidence and trust in God.

Many of the phrases of the actual text are inscribed in the window, but much more striking are the visual images depicting the text. Included are events in the life of Christ from the Annunciation and Nativity through the Resurrection, Ascension, and Enthronement. The window also contains images of saints throughout the ages: Old Testament patriarchs and prophets, New Testament apostles, martyrs and other leaders of the early church. The overall effect of this collection of images inspired by this great hymn of the historic church serves to remind us of our connection to the church universally through time and space, a very fitting reminder for the week in which we celebrate All Saints Sunday. As we gather for worship each week may we always remember that we are connected to the "holy church throughout all the world" and to all those who have been baptized and called to live in Christ across the centuries.
