How can you live out the reality of "God with us" in the midst of daily interactions and challenges? For what are you seeking divine guidance? What visions and dreams—for your life, for our congregation, for our world—has God placed in your heart? What would it mean for you to trust those dreams and take steps to live into them? What helps you maintain faith and take first steps when the path forward is not yet fully revealed?
