Questions for Reflection —

- What does it mean to you to renew your baptism? What does it look like for you to more fully claim your baptismal identity as a beloved child of God? What does your baptismal identity mean for your relationships within church community? How might we collectively as a family of baptized believers best live into the commitment to journey together? In what ways can we further affirm and encourage one another? How can we more fully embody the notion that Christ has opened the church to people of all ages, nations, and races?
- What difference does your identity as a baptized Christian make in your daily life? How have you known the transforming power of baptism in your life? What will help you remain open to ongoing transformation? What do you think God’s vision for your life is presently? What gets in the way of your being all that God has called you to be? What spiritual practices help you to listen for God's prompting for your life's direction?
- With what gifts and graces have you been blessed? How have the ways in which you serve God and the ways in which you live out your discipleship changed over time? In what ways would you like to deepen your commitment as a follower of Christ? To what new role or ministry in the life of our congregation might God now be calling you? What do you need in order to take the next faithful step for you on the path to which God is calling you?
