Questions for Reflection —

- What does it mean to you that we worship the Triune God? To which person of the Trinity do you most frequently address your prayers? With which member of the Trinity do you have the strongest sense of experienced direct relationship? Why is that? How might you open yourself to a broader relationship encompassing the fullness of the Trinity? What is the importance to you of community and relationship with other members of the family of Christ? What would it look like for you to invest more deeply in our community of faith?
- How have you seen God’s glory reflected in the natural world? How have you encountered God through God’s creation? What does it mean to you that God has entrusted the care of creation to humanity? What do you think responsible stewardship of our planet—plants, animals, natural resources, the environment—looks like? What practical steps can you personally take to be a better steward of God’s creation? How can we as a congregation be more faithful in stewardship of creation?
- What would it look like for you to engage the Great Commission as you go about daily life in your neighborhood and workplace? How can you be more intentional about using your gifts and resources in a way that has a transformational impact? Is there someone whom God might be calling you to mentor on the journey of faith? What challenges you as you consider your role and responsibility in making disciples? What does ongoing growth as a disciple look like for you as you continue your spiritual journey? What can we as a congregation do to encourage deeper discipleship in our faith community?

Loving God, You are Creator, who made the whole world and loves us like Your children. You are Jesus, Your Son, who came to show us how to live with kindness and love.
